NEWS FROM EDUCATIONAL SERVICES

District-wide Meeting: The second district-wide staff meetings were held in various locations across the District on November 9.

The elementary teachers compared the student data from the first Student Progress Assessment (SPA) or the kindergarten and first grade assessments located on ESGI and the second assessment administered in November. Based on these discussions teachers evaluated their SMART Goals and revised/developed the goals to meet the academic needs of their students.

Content-alike teams shared strategies they are utilizing in their classes to improve student achievement in order to meet the SMART goals the teams set in September. For English and Math teachers, data from the Student Progress Assessment will assist them in measuring student progress toward meeting these goals at the next district-wide meeting in January. English teachers also continued a discussion regarding vertical articulation between the junior high and high school English teachers during their meetings. From this discussion, a plan is being developed for a vertical articulation meeting for English in the near future.

On-line Independent Study and Credit Recovery: Melanie Mol from Education 2020, CUSD's provider of on-line curriculum, returned to the district's independent study programs at Chico High, Pleasant Valley and Oakdale (on the Fair View campus) to provide more individual instruction in best practices for utilizing the curriculum.

All three independent study programs now have students utilizing the on-line program as the curriculum for at least part of their educational program.

Charter School Update: The CUSD Board of Trustees held public hearings for the renewal charter petitions for Nord County School and Inspire School of Arts and Sciences at the November 16 board meeting. The charter petitions for both schools will come back to the CUSD board as action items at the December 7 board meeting.

Tdap: Many thanks to the school nurses, health assistants, school office managers and principals for all of their efforts with the new Tdap requirement. As of today, there are less than 10 students (of approximately 6000) who have not yet met this requirement. CUSD is 99.99% Tdap compliant!

Special Education Self Review: The Special Education Self-Review (SESR) is an intensive multi-step appraisal process during which students' IEPs are evaluated for legal compliance, implementation and educational benefit. The fiscal and policy components of the program are also reviewed. District Advisory Council (DAC): The DAC met on November 17 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Agenda topics included District Calendar, District Assessments, California Common Core

Standards and Class-Size Reduction. The main purpose of the DAC is to provide a forum for open two-way communication between the district and school sites. There are two classified representatives, a teacher representative from each school and from administration.

Leadership Institute: Deanna Holen, Joanne Bettencourt, Dave Murgia, Judi Roth, Erica Sheridan and Mike Morris participated in a countywide Leadership Institute on November 14 from 4:00-7:00 p.m. Dave McKay offered a great presentation.

Assessment Data Management System: Glenn Pulliam, Brett Silva, Laurie Barnes, Tim Cariss Dan Sours, Ted Sullivan, John Bohannon and Mike Morris met after school on the November 15 for an informational presentation about *Illuminate*, an Assessment Data Management System. We currently use the Edusoft system to collect and analyze student assessment results. We are looking at systems that could potentially offer better student assessment data collecting and reporting capabilities at the same or lower cost.

California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE): The next administration of the CAHSEE will be February 7 and 8, 2012, for all students in grade 10, and for students in grades 11 and 12 who have not yet passed. CAHSEE results may be found at CAHSEE) Results.

CELDT Testing: The California English Language Development Test (CELDT) test is given each year to students identified as English learners during July through October. Our CELDT examiners just finished up annual CELDT testing. The CELDT has three purposes: (1) to identify students who are limited English proficient; (2) to determine the level of English language proficiency of students who are limited English proficient; and (3) to assess the progress of limited English proficient students in acquiring the skills of listening, reading, speaking, and writing in English. STAR Testing: We are currently compiling our STAR orders for 2011-2012. The dates for the STAR Writing Test in grades 4 & 7 will be March 6 and 7, 2012. Districtwide Student Progress Assessments: The administration of the District Progress Assessments took place from October 24 to November 4 for grades 2-6. Grade 2-6 teachers reviewed results at the November 9 Districtwide Meeting. Students in grades 7-11 took the Districtwide Student Progress Assessments during the week of November 14 – 18 and November 28 – December 2. Grades 2-11 were assessed in English and Math at the beginning of the school year to establish a baseline for measuring progress in the learning. Speaking of Thanksgiving - Nutrition Services would like to thank all school sites for participating in the Turkey Feast. It was a wonderful opportunity for administrative staff to interact with students in the district. I hope everyone involved was as inspired as I was by the students' reactions - Priceless!!! (See pictures at the end of this Update.) On another note, the department is up 8% for breakfast meals and 11% for lunch meals YTD over last year YTD. I attribute the increase to the staff's dedication to customer service and providing the freshest most nutritious food we can.

Information Technology and the uniFLOW (aka. Copier/Printer System) and Schedule: The idea behind centralizing copier/printers is to save money and administrative overhead. Each site no longer has to worry about contracts. Under the new contract each school is allotted MFP Black and White copies and HP LaserJet Black and White copies per student at no cost to the school site. Copies and overages will be assessed on a quarterly basis from a billing statement generated by Ray Morgan. The reports that are generated by uniFLOW for the staff and/or organizations within the school (i.e. ASB, PTA, etc.) are for site administration for bill back and to understand any charge backs for overages over the free allotment of copies/prints.

We have created a tentative uniFLOW rollout schedule for the remainder of the school sites. Some adjustments to this list may be required as we make arrangements with the various sites. The District Office, Corp Yard, Junior High schools, and Chapman have been our pilot sites and have endured working out many of the issues. We received great feedback from the high schools from last week and this week. Thanks for all of your help and support.


