- > Speakers will not be allowed to yield their time to other speakers.
- > Immediately following the conclusion of the Action Calendar, if necessary, the Hearing Session/Public forum will be re-opened. Priority will be given to those speakers who have remained throughout the meeting to address the Board. Again, speakers will be limited to 5 minutes.
- > Speakers will respect the time limit granted for their presentation. Those speakers unwilling to respect the time limit will be asked to discontinue their presentation by the Chair. An unwillingness to halt a presentation after being directed will, at the discretion of the Chair, result in the meeting being called into "recess" until such time that the meeting can resume in an orderly fashion.
- No disturbance or willful interruption of any Board meeting shall be permitted. Persistence by an individual or group shall be grounds for the Chair to terminate the privilege of addressing the meeting. The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared if necessary. In this case, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda.
