Background information

The District has entered into a contract with Four Seasons Roofing to reroof a major portion of the covered walkway on the Pleasant Valley High School campus. The first part of this scope of work involves ripping off the existing roofing and making minor dry rot repairs. Upon opening up the roof it was apparent that there was a need for major dry rot repairs. The extent of the dry rot was reviewed by the project structural engineer. It has been determined that the repairs should be conducted by a General Contractor rather than a Roofing Contractor.

The District has adopted as Board Policy the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act. The Act contains provisions which help public entities deal with emergency situations. In cases of emergency when repair or replacements are necessary, the District can complete the work without going through the lengthy bid process with 4/5ths of the Board's approval. Due to the dry rot damages discovered in the covered walk-ways at Pleasant Valley High School, there is an urgent need to get the necessary repair work completed as soon as possible. This structural damage is being addressed by the architect and structural engineer and will require Department of the State Architect approval. Since this will lengthen the process even more, going out to bid and having the project completed prior to the start of school will be an issue.

Broward Builders is currently completing the Center for the Arts on the PVHS campus. Broward Builders has extensive experience with the type of structural systems which make up the covered walkways, have personnel currently working on the site and the ability to expedite the procurement of materials for the necessary repairs. We recommend entering into an agreement with Broward Builders to make the necessary dry rot repairs on a time and material basis. Once the repairs are completed, Four Seasons Roofing would complete the remainder of the roofing project.

Educational Implications

The District's Strategic Plan states: "A safe, nurturing and inspiring environment is essential for individuals to thrive."

Fiscal Implications

This project will be funded with Deferred Maintenance dollars. No impact on the General Fund.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board recognize that conditions exist which warrant entering into an emergency contract and direct District staff to enter into an agreement with Broward Builders to complete the dry rot repairs.
