**INFORMATION, PROCEDURES AND CONDUCT
OF CUSD BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETINGS**

No disturbance or willful interruption of any Board meeting shall be permitted. Persistence by an individual or group shall be grounds for the Chair to terminate the privilege of addressing the meeting. The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared, if necessary. In this case, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda.

CONSENT CALENDAR

The items listed on the Consent Calendar may be approved by the Board in one action. However, in accordance with law, the public has a right to comment on any consent item. At the request of a member of the Board, any item on the consent agenda shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a regular agenda item. Board Bylaw 9322.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION

At the discretion of the Board President, student speakers may be given priority to address items to the Board.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION FOR ITEMS ON THE AGENDA (Regular and Special Board Meetings)

The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board either before or during the Board's consideration of each item of business to be discussed at regular or special meetings.

- Speakers will identify themselves and will direct their comments to the Board.
- Each speaker will be allowed three (3) minutes to address the Board.
- In case of numerous requests to address the same item, the Board may select representatives to speak on each side of the item.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA (Regular Board Meetings only)

The Board shall not take action or enter into discussion or dialog on any matter that is not on the meeting agenda, except as allowed by law. (Government Code 54954.2) Items brought forth at this part of the meeting may be referred to the Superintendent or designee or the Board may take the item under advisement. The matter may be placed on the agenda of a subsequent meeting for discussion or action by the Board.

- Public comments for items not on the agenda will be limited to one hour in duration (15 minutes at the beginning of the meeting and 45 minutes at the end of the meeting).
- Initially, each general topic will be limited to 3 speakers.
- Speakers will identify themselves and will direct their comments to the Chair.
- Each speaker will be given three (3) minutes to address the Board.
- Once 2 speakers have shared a similar viewpoint, the Chair will ask for a differing viewpoint. If no other viewpoint is represented then a 3rd speaker may present.
- Speakers will not be allowed to yield their time to other speakers.
- After all topics have been heard, the remainder of the hour may be used by additional speakers to address a previously raised issue.

WRITTEN MATERIAL:

The Board is unable to read written materials presented during the meeting. If any person intends to appear before the Board with written materials, they should be delivered to the Superintendent's Office or delivered via e-mail to the Board and Superintendent 10 days prior to the meeting date.

9.2. EDUCATIONAL SERVICES**9.2.1. Discussion/Action: New Course Offerings for Agriculture Department**

At 6:41 p.m. Principal Jim Hanlon presented information on the two additional course options that the Agriculture Department at Chico High School would like to offer: 1) Ag Marketing and 2) Veterinary Science and Technology. The Ag Marketing course is intended to support and enrich the school farm where students will learn the economics of Ag Business and what it takes to make money and account for expenses in an Agriculture venture. The Veterinary Science and Technology Class will offer an opportunity to learn about animal physiology and anatomy specifically related to agriculture. Board Clerk Robinson moved to approve the two courses; seconded by Board Vice President Griffin.

Reach for the Future is an annual leadership conference hosted by the Butte County Department of Behavioral Health. The conference is a leadership opportunity for youth and during the conference, youth participate in a Challenge Day (where they learn about how their actions contribute to the environment around them), in workshops (on topics such as: ATOD prevention, building healthy relationships, bullying prevention, reducing prejudice, etc.). Youth also participate in an Odyssey ropes course, during which they overcome obstacles using teamwork and personal perseverance. The 3 day conference is a highlight of the school year for all young people who attend. Overall, the conference is designed to promote mental health while building skill and resiliency in young people.

Education Implications

Students who attend do miss 1.5 school days (they leave at lunch on a Thursday and return that same Saturday). However, the conference provides opportunities for young people that they might not otherwise receive. The benefits of attending Reach for the Future are great not only for students, but for what students share with others when they return to campus.

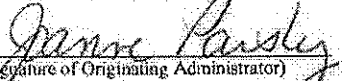

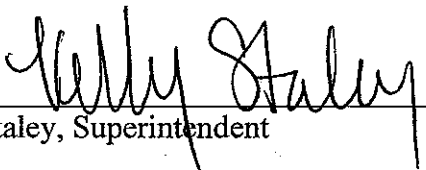

V. *Grading Policy:

Assessment/ Grading: is based on the following criteria.

Preparedness: Students should come to rehearsals with all the necessary equipment and supplies, i.e. instrument in good working order, music, pencil, rosin, reeds, etc.; and a serious musical attitude.

Effort & Participation: Students should be in their assigned seats on time and ready to play when the baton goes up and cut off when the signal is given. Correct posture is an accurate indication of engagement in the learning activity. Poor posture or playing position is often an indication of lack of effort or engagement.

Performance Assessment: Students will be asked to play by stand(s), by section, and in quartets. Individual assessments will be based on the student's ability to perform rhythms, dynamics, intonation, notes, and tempo accurately and with a good tone quality.

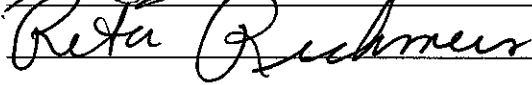

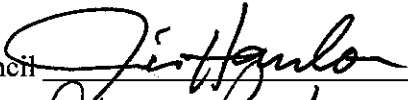
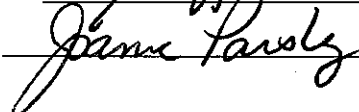

Background Information:

Tracking enrollment and ADA (Average Daily Attendance) data is vital to accurately projecting class size, school site capacities, and ultimately, district revenues. Enrollments are tracked daily for the first two weeks of school and then monthly thereafter. While we also evaluate the ADA with the monthly data, the district general fund revenue is funded on P2 (around 8th month) cumulative attendance.

Education Implications:

Monitoring enrollment is critical to ensuring that classes are of the appropriate size and configuration, ensuring that instructional opportunities are provided for all students.

Fiscal Implications/Analysis of Attached Reports:

The attached document shows that the district is within target in the current projections. Continued monitoring of enrollment as well as the newly implemented A2A (Attention 2 Attendance) software should keep the district in good standing to meet or exceed projections for 2011-12.

Background Information

We are in the last year of a three (3) year cycle of the student calendar. Per board request, we have sought input from staff, parents, students, labor groups, administrators and community members on this topic. Several months ago we set up an email account dedicated to feedback on the student calendar. Information requesting input on the student calendar for the next three years has been included in various school newsletters, the Superintendent's Update and in the local media. We have received numerous emails from parents, staff and students, consulted directly with our labor groups and the Board has heard from many of those attending past meetings on this topic. The topic has been discussed with the District Advisory Council and at PTA meetings.

On January 18, 2012, six (6) variations of possible calendars were brought forward for discussion with the Board and the community. For the three (3) years involved this resulted in eighteen (18) calendars. At the Board's request, an additional option was included and placed on the District's website for consideration. This option has the following characteristics for the three years involved;

- Mid August start
- Ending the first semester prior to winter break
- Maintaining the four (4) day weekend in February
- Keeping the static spring break in March
- Creating a four (4) day weekend around Easter with the Friday before and the Monday after Easter as non-student days

There are now twenty one (21) calendars presented for discussion. Other variations can certainly be considered.

SUBJECT: 2012/2013 Chico Unified School District Student Housing Recommendations

Consistent with Chico Unified School District procedures, student housing alternatives have been studied and recommendations have been formulated for the 2012/13 school year. Background information

The Facilities Department contracted with McMillan Tree Service (a local certified arborist) to prune back the large Valley Oak at Chapman Elementary and provide an overall report on the condition of the tree. Scott McMillan attempted to prune the tree, but found a large cavern in a large arm of the tree. For safety reasons, Mr. McMillan recommended that the tree be removed. The District contacted North Valley Tree Service (Tom Bettencourt) to get a second opinion on the health of the tree. Tom Bettencourt stated that the main trunks of the tree are hollow, as a result of large cuts that were made many years ago. He recommended removing the tree since it is located on a school campus.

Educational Implications

The District's Strategic Plan states: "A safe, nurturing and inspiring environment is essential for individuals to thrive."

Fiscal Implications

The fee for removal and disposal of the Valley Oak will be \$1950.00. Work will be performed by McMillan Tree Service.
