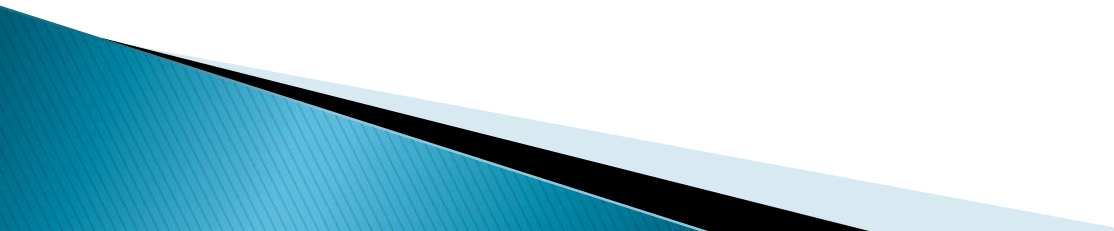

Why Does the District Provide Preschool Programs and Services?

- **IDEA–2004: Children with Disabilities have a right to a Free and Appropriate Education (FAPE) in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)**
 - **Services Provided from birth through Age 22**
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Preschool Service Providers


- **The County Office of Education *Early Start* program provides services for children from birth to 3 years of age**
- **The District provides preschool services for children from 3 to 5 years of age**

What students are served at Loma Vista?

Broad range of children

- Preschool: 3 to 5 years of age
- School age: 6 to 22 years of age

Broad range of disabilities

- Physical disabilities
 - Intellectual disabilities
 - Speech and Language
 - Autism
 - Multiple disabilities

District Special Day Classrooms

**10 Total Classrooms with
121 children**


- **9 classrooms serving 112 preschool students**
- **1 classroom serving 9 elementary and secondary students**



Innovative Preschool Classrooms

- Innovative is a private not-for-profit preschool
 - Innovative operates in 2 classrooms shared with District programs (blended model)
 - Innovative enrollment: 64 children
 - Innovative capacity: 80 children
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Why Does the District Partner With Innovative Preschool?

- **Students with Disabilities have the right to receive their education services in the LRE: an environment as close to the general education environment as possible**
 - **The Innovative Preschool Program provides services to typically developing children that play and learn with students with disabilities served by the District**

Speech Services at Loma Vista

- **Three preschool speech therapists provide services to preschool children**
- **The speech therapists work in 6 different work stations in the facility**
- **Total students receiving preschool speech services: 105 students**

Other Service Providers

Nurse

- One office for two School Nurses and one Licensed Vocational Nurse

Adapted Physical Education

- One office for two Adapted Physical Education teachers

Inclusion Support Specialist Teachers

- One office for two teachers
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Other Service Providers (Continued)

Physical and Health Impairments Specialist Teacher (Itinerant)

- One closet for one teacher

School Psychologists

- Three psychologists share one office

Principal / Assistant Principal

- One office for each

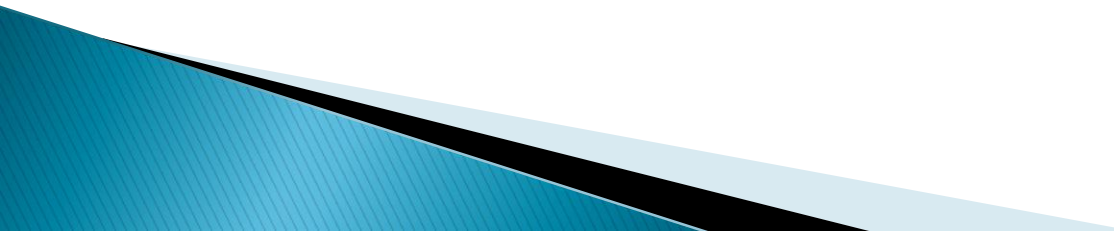
BCOE Staff at Loma Vista

The **Butte County Office of Education** owns a portable building located on the Loma Vista site that is shared by District and BCOE staff as follows:

- Early Start Program (Birth to Three)
- Assistive Technology Specialist
- Program Specialist, Occupational Therapists and OT Aides
- Inclusion Support Teachers



California Children's Services

- **The District is obligated to provide a space for the Medical Therapy Unit (MTU) operated by the California Children's Services Program**
 - **The MTU is located in an area approximately equivalent to two classrooms**
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California Children's Services

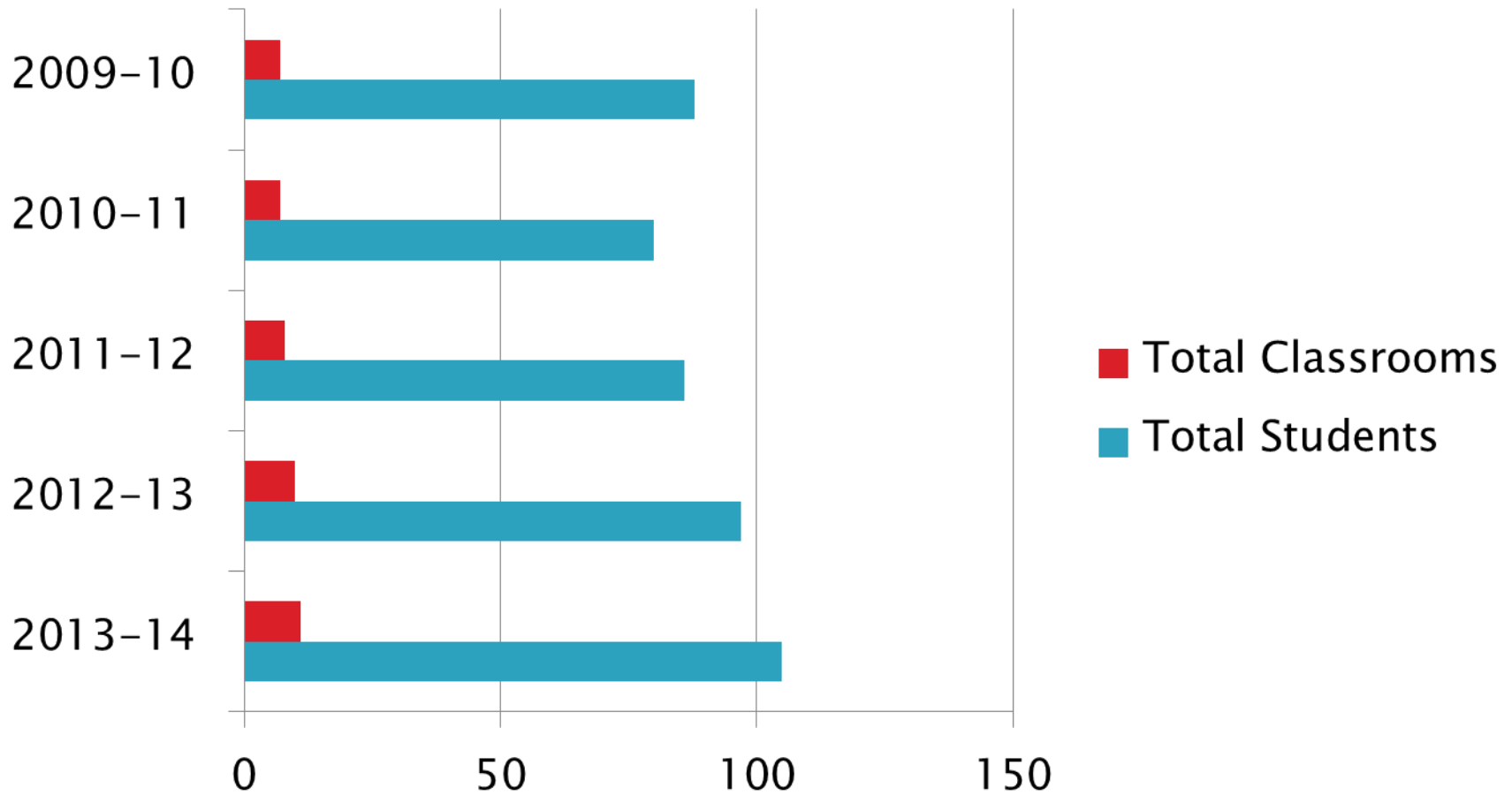
Children who have handicapping conditions, generally due to neurological or musculoskeletal disorders, are eligible for services through the MTU

CCS provides

- Physical therapy
- Occupational therapy
- Medical therapy conference (MTC) services

The Loma Vista MTU serves students residing in the northern section of Butte County

Unique Campus Features

- **Playgrounds** – 2 playgrounds specially designed for preschool children and for preschool children with disabilities are located on the campus
- **Sensory gym** – a sensory gym which supports sensory and physical development is located at Loma Vista. The Poison Apple Beauty Salon and the Lion's Club made a significant donation to this program about 4 years ago
