Background Information

The Measure E Phase I Quick Start projects were approved by the board on December 11, 2013. The IT department and Facilities department have been working closely on the implementation of these projects. One of the projects is the Data Center at the District Office. This is where the servers and network for the entire district reside. We have completed extensive research and solutions for this phase of the project.

Educational Implications

The server and network infrastructure is improving with the investments Chico USD is making in technology. As a result, instruction in the classrooms utilizing technology is increasing. With this project, the dependability and reliability of the servers and networks used for this instruction will be improved.

Fiscal Implications

The budget allocation of Measure E funds for this phase of the project is \$315,000. The original RFP response was over \$320,000. The Facilities and IT departments have developed a plan that would complete the project well under the \$315,000 allocation by splitting the project into parts and doing some of the work in-house. Below is an estimate of the project:

Background Information

Chico Unified School District (CUSD) entered into agreement with Chico Area Recreation and Park District (CARD) on November 23, 1976 to cooperate with one another for the purpose of authorizing, promoting, and conducting programs of community recreation which would contribute to the attainment of general recreation and educational objectives for children and adults associated with CUSD and CARD. The original 1976 agreement states "CARD and CUSD shall name each other as additional insureds as respects the use of the other's facilities, equipment, and vehicles." The liability amounts from 1976 no longer represented current market values. Addendum No. 3 reflects current market values, increasing general liability to a minimum limit of \$5,000,000 each occurrence and \$5,000,000 aggregate.

CUSD and CARD have each provided a certificate of insurance showing this coverage amount, naming the other additional insured.

Increasing the liability limits makes no significant change in our overall insurance costs.

ADDENDUM NO. 3

TO THE MOU BETWEEN CHICO AREA RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT AND CHICO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DATED NOVEMBER 23, 1976

During the term of this agreement, Chico Area Recreation and Park District (CARD) shall annually provide to Chico Unified School District (CUSD) and CUSD shall annually provide to CARD, a Certificate of Coverage evidencing the following coverages:

<u>Commercial General Liability</u> with a minimum limit of \$5,000,000 each occurrence and \$5,000,000 aggregate.

Additional Covered Party Provision:

From CARD to CUSD: Naming Chico Unified School District, their elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers as additional covered party under the general liability policy during CARD use of a CUSD owned property.

From CUSD to CARD: Naming Chico Area Recreation and Park District, their elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers as additional covered party under the general liability policy during a CUSD use of a CARD owned property.

Primary Insurance:

From CARD to CUSD: Endorsement showing the Chico Area Recreation and Park District's coverage shall be primary coverage as respects to CUSD, their elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers during CARD use of a CUSD owned property. Any insurance, self-insurance or insurance pool coverage maintained by CUSD, their elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers shall be excess and shall not contribute with it.

From CUSD to CARD: Endorsement showing the Chico Unified School District's coverage is primary coverage as respects to CARD, its elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers during a CUSD use of a CARD owned property. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by CARD, their elected or appointed officials, employees, and volunteers shall be excess of CUSD and shall not contribute with it.

CUSD and CARD agree that the terms of the hold harmless and indemnification on Page 5 of original contract, and Certificate of Coverage terms as shown in section above, shall supersede the hold harmless and indemnification agreement and insurance required of applicant terms which may be contained in a CUSD "Use of Facilities" form.



("Grantor") hereby grants to CALIFORNIA WATER SERVICE COMPANY, a California public utility was corporation, ("Grantee"), a non-exclusive easement in gross, consisting of the right from time to time to construct reconstruct, install, inspect, maintain, repair, replace, remove, operate and use facilities of the type hereinant specified, together with a right of way for such facilities and ingress to and egress from such facilities, upon, across and/or under the lands situated in the City of Chico, County of Butte, State of California, described as follows:

PARCEL 1

A 20.00 foot wide easement for waterline purposes and appurtenances over, under and across all that portion of the Northwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 35, Township 22 North, Range 1 East, M.D.B.&M., and further described on the map of the Village of Oakdale, recorded in the Recorder's Office of the County of Butte, as the "School House Block". Lying 10 feet on each side of the centerline of said easement being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the most easterly corner of that certain parcel of land as shown on that Record of Survey filed February 11, 2014 in the Office of the Recorder, County of Butte, State of California, in Book 184 of Maps, at page 70; Thence North 44° 15' 06" East 80.25 feet to the most southerly corner of said "School House Block" and the intersection of the northeasterly right-of-way line of Broadway and the northwesterly right-of-way line of 11th Street;

Thence North 35° 29' 31" East 516.01 feet, more or less on and along said northwesterly right-of-way line of 11th Street to a point as described in the deed to the City of Chico filed June 14, 1994 in the Office of the Recorder, County of Butte, State of California, under Recorder's Serial Number 94-024864;

Thence North 09° 28' 01" West 13.44 feet, more or less, to a point on the southwesterly right-of-way line of Park Avenue as shown in said deed to the City of Chico;


Thence North 54° 25' 32" West, 141.39 feet, on and along said southwesterly right-of-way line also being the northeasterly line of said "School House Block";

Thence North 58° 42' 43" West 11.19 feet continuing on and along said southwesterly right-of-way line of Park Avenue to the **True Point of Beginning** for the herein described easement centerline;

Thence South 35° 29' 31" West 9.19 feet to a point hereinafter referred to as Point "A";

Thence South 35° 29' 31" West 79.57 feet;

Thence South 09° 11' 54" East 49.96 feet to the terminus of the herein described centerline.



The above described strip(s) or parcel(s) of land are referred to in this Grant of Easement as the "Easement Area" and is shown on the map attached hereto as an exhibit.

The Easement Area and the facilities installed by Grantee thereon shall be used by Grantee for the conveyance, distribution and/or storage of water, and the installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair, relocation, replacement and removal of such pipes, conduits, meters, valves, fittings, boxes, vaults, hydrants, pipeline markers, and other facilities as Grantee deems necessary or convenient in connection with Grantee's business as a public utility water company and for any other legally permitted purpose.

Grantor hereby reserves, for itself, its successors and assigns, the right to use the surface of the Easement Area for parking, landscaping, walkways, signs and driveways; provided that Grantor shall not erect or construct any building or other structure, or otherwise conduct activities in the Easement Area which may impair or prevent Grantee's use of the Easement Area for the purposes specified herein. Grantor shall not engage in activities that damage or is reasonably likely to damage, Grantee's facilities and equipment in the Easement Area. Without limiting the foregoing, Grantor shall not perform or permit any digging, tunneling or other forms of construction activity on the Easement Area which would substantially disturb, or are likely to substantially disturb the compaction or unearth Grantee's facilities located within the Easement Area or endanger the lateral support to such facilities.

Grantee hereby agrees that Grantee shall vacate the Easement Area and any improvements constructed by Grantee thereon and relocate its facilities to a reasonable alternative Easement Area, at Grantor's sole cost and expense upon ninety (90) days written notice from Grantor to Grantee. Upon such relocation, Grantee shall deliver to Grantor a quitclaim deed releasing Grantee's interest in the vacated Easement Area.







Background Information

On January 22[,] 2014, the board approved a contract between Chico USD and Computers for Classrooms. The previous agreement was a memorandum of understanding (MOU) which was in place for a number of years. At the board meeting it was asked for the district to report and quantify what we received from Computers for Classrooms by reporting the number of computers and laptops we receive on a quarterly basis. This report is an update on what we received from Computers for Classrooms for the 2013-14 school year.

Educational Implications

CUSD now has over 5800 computers on our network with nearly 4000 checking in every day. The computers are used across the district in classrooms for teachers and students, libraries, computer labs and in school and district offices. We are now also needing to supply and support computers and laptops to charter schools under CUSD.

Fiscal Implications

We received 95 laptops and 482 PC's from Computer for Classrooms just this past quarter. This brings the total number of computers CUSD received this fiscal year to 3,141. If we paid \$250 for each computer, it would have cost the district over \$785,000. These dollar figures do not include the numerous monitors, keyboards, mice, cables, dual video graphics cards, extra hard drives and other components we have also received from Computers for Classrooms.

<u>Additional Information</u>

The cost of refreshing CUSD computer and laptop hardware would take millions of dollars if we purchased new, used or refurbished computers on a regular cycle. Without another plan and/or more resources for the laptops and computers in our classrooms, libraries, labs and offices, we need to foster our relationship and understand the great value we have for the \$150,000. To date, that is about \$48 per computer/laptop.

Administration brings this issue to the board for discussion since a member of the public has expressed concerns regarding the limited public access of the bike/pedestrian path.


Educational Implications

Background Information

Chico Unified School District (CUSD) had three General Obligation (G.O.) bond elections approved in: 1988 - \$18,425,000; 1998 - \$48,725,000 (Measure A); and 2012 - \$78,000,000 (Measure E). Currently the district has three bond issuances outstanding as follows:

1998 Measure A – Series B \$30,725,000

2012 Refunding of 1988 & 1998 Bonds \$18,665,000

2012 Measure E – Series A \$15,000,000

Please note, the label of "Series" relates to an actual bond sale of a portion of the total bond indebtedness approved by voters. The 1988 and 1998 bonds have been fully issued and dollars spent on new and improved facilities for Chico Unified students. Of the \$78 million approved in 2012 Measure E, \$15 million has been issued with \$63 million yet to be sold. It is important to note the 2012 Measure E was promoted as a "tax rate extension measure", meaning the district could issue new bonds and tax payers would pay approximately the same amount of property taxes paid previously.

Administration wants to ensure the Board of Trustees and the public are informed of the CUSD bond program, noting the specifics of the current debt issued and the options to sell bonds in the future to implement the district's Facilities Master Plan. To assist in this Board Workshop, Government Financial Strategies Inc. (GFSI), a third party financial advisor not involved in the sale of the 2012 Measure E, Series A, will provide a report and be in attendance to answer questions. Also in attendance will be the Butte County Treasurer, Peggy Moak, and bond counsel for the 2012 Measure E, David Casnocha.

Educational Implications

Bond dollars have and will be used to build new school facilities and improve school facilities to provide a safe, healthy, and engaging environment for learning to take place.

Fiscal Implications

Bonds are paid through local property taxes. The district maintains separate funds to account for expenditures of bond funds and for debt service to account for bond principal and interest payments. Although there is no impact to CUSD's operational budget, the district is aware of the impact to the taxpayers and the need to provide transparent, accurate information on how their dollars are used to improve school facilities in our community.
