- 7.1 Jonathon Edwards of Government Financial Strategies, Inc. presented the Developer Fee Justification Study. Based upon analyses and findings contained in the Developer Fee Justification Study, each new home in the CUSD will cause \$4,420 in school facilities costs, which equates to \$2.96 per square foot for the expected average size new home. Therefore, the District is justified in imposing the maximum statutory residential developer fee of \$2.14 per square foot on all new residential development.
- 7.2 Pam Hospers reviewed the key findings of the California Healthy Kids Survey for CUSD, Fall 2001. The CHKS targets students in grades 7, 9 & 11. Each student's participation is completely voluntary and anonymous and required the written consent of a parent or guardian.

- 7.4 Mike Weissenborn, Facilities/Construction Manager presented the monthly facilities update.

CVHS – On Wednesday, June 26, 2002 at 7:00 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room at Little Chico Creek Elementary School there will be a Public Hearing. This meeting will allow the public an opportunity to make comments regarding the Draft Environmental Impact Report for CVHS.

MJHS – The foundations for the MJHS Gym have been poured. On Friday, June 21, the slabs for the gym will be poured.

CHS – The "destruction" phase of the project is almost complete and then the construction phase can begin. The gym renovations are still on target for completion at the end of November, 2002.

- 7.5 Gloria Bevers, Director Education Services and Greg Frank, Teacher at Chapman presented the Annual Peer Assistance and Review end of year report. In 2001-02, 3 teachers were referred for unsatisfactory evaluations; 9 teachers volunteered for consulting teacher assistance and 25 new teachers supported through PAR (BTSA). Activities included: Surveying all K-12 teachers for staff development needs for 2002-03; assigned PAR Liaisons to each school site to assist in encouraging teacher participation; rewrote contract language for Article 22; developed new teacher evaluation instrument that is directly tied to the California Standards for the Teaching Profession – this will be negotiated in 2002-03. Goals and Activities for 2002-03 include: Increase teacher participation in the PAR program; develop a Guidelines and Procedures Handbook to assist in the operation of the program; increase the consulting teacher base to provide more choice and to assist in meeting identified staff needs.
- 7.6 Randy Meeker, Assistant Superintendent Business Services reviewed the 2002-03 CUSD Budget. The budget shows total revenues projected at \$90.6 million against projected expenditures totaling \$91.8. \$1.8 million in budget reductions is included by allocating cuts on a percentage basis to all groups including certificated, administration, classified, and operations. COLA is expected to be 1.66% although in the Governor's May Revise, Governor Davis is proposing a 2% COLA. The Equalization aid that was previously promised by Governor Davis has been cut. The budget also included a 1.5% pay increase for all employee groups for the 2002-03 year. ADA is projected to be down by 87 next year. Mr. Meeker emphasized that at this point the budget is the "best assumption" that can be made until the State adopts their budget. Mr. Meeker said that within 45 days of the State budget adoption, he will present the Board with a Revised 2002-03 budget.

At 8:40 p.m., Ms. Sisco opened the Public Hearing. Members of the audience expressed their concerns over the reduction of a nurse and the effects of reduced nursing services. A parent from Forest Ranch expressed

concern over the reduction of a teacher at Forest Ranch Elementary. Dr. Brown stated that if the enrollment numbers continue to stay the same or increase, the teaching position at Forest Ranch will not be eliminated. There were no further comments and at 9:00 p.m., the Public Hearing was closed.
