In an effort to meet the individual needs of all students enrolled in the Chico Unified School District, the District maintains an alternative educational program which provides special learning opportunities for qualifying students who evidence exceptional intellectual, creative or leadership capacity. This program is entitled the Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) Program. The classes are offered in a variety of formats: pullout, cluster groups within regular classes, special classes offered outside the regular school day.

### REQUIRED ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTICE TO PARENTS, STAFF AND EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS

As required by Federal law, parents, staff members and the exclusive representatives of employees will receive an annual "Asbestos Notice" as follows:

### Contents of Notification

Chico Unified School District schools/facilities have been inspected for asbestos containing materials and "Asbestos Management Plans" have been developed for each facility in the District. A copy of the "Asbestos Management Plan" for each school in the District is available in the principal's office; or copies of all management plans are available in the District Office, 1163 East Seventh Street, or the District Corporation Yard, 2455 Carmichael Drive. As required by law, surveillance of all facilities in the District will be completed every six months.

Some asbestos containing material was removed from Chico Junior High School, Chico Senior High School and Chapman, Citrus, Hooker Oak and Rosedale Elementary Schools during the reconstruction of those schools. Other schools scheduled for reconstruction will receive asbestos abatement services when those schools are reconstructed in future years. Additionally, small amounts of asbestos containing material will be periodically encased and/or removed on an as-needed basis to complement the use and maintenance of those facilities.
