Goal 1: Quality Teachers, Materials, and Facilities



Expected Annual Measurable Outcomes:

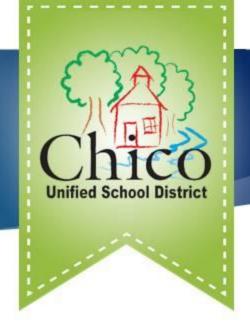
Maintain compliance with Williams Act requirements:

- 100% of teachers will be highly-qualified
- 100% of students have instructional materials
- All facilities will have a 'Good' or 'Excellent' rating

At least 55% of CUSD students will have access to computer technology at any given time.

Provide tech instructional aides and teacher professional development in technology.

Goal 1: Actions and Services

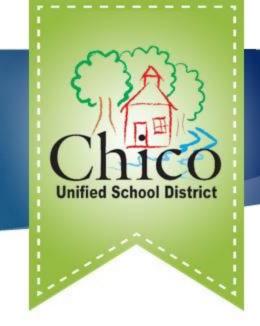


- 1. Review credentials and assignments.
- 2. Purchase instructional materials and educational software, including materials for students in identified subgroups.
- 3. Regularly inspect and maintain facilities.

Goal 1: Actions and Services

- Purchase devices for students and teachers per district technology needs (e.g. Chromebooks).
- 5. Employ instructional aides for technology, librarians, and Library Media assistants.
- Continue providing information to families on resources supporting technology: Computers for Classrooms & Comcast Internet Access.

Goal 2: Quality Teachers, Materials, and Facilities



Expected Annual Measurable Outcomes:

CUSD teachers and schools will move from stage 2 to stage 3 of CCSS implementation: aligning assessments and progress monitoring tools.

Students will continue to receive CCSS aligned instruction, show a 3% increase over baseline on SBAC.

Goal 2: Actions and Services

Chico Unified School District

- 1. Teachers evaluate current status and next steps in CCSS Implementation.
- 2. Provide <u>professional development in:</u>
 - California Common Core State Standards
 - Before school and school-year professional development in English Language Development
 - Technology hardware (e.g. Chromebooks) and applications (e.g. Google Apps for Education).

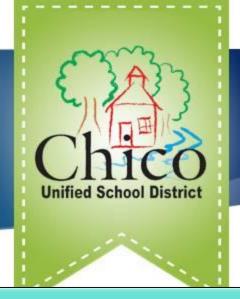
Goal 2: Actions and Services



3. Continue to develop and refine a IK-12 sequence of common assessments aligned to CCSS (staff and district meeting time).

4. Release time for <u>peer rounds observations</u> and debrief.

Goal 3: High Levels of Student Achievement



Expected Annual Measurable Outcomes:

Implement college /
career plan established
in year one, ensuring
that at a minimum all
freshmen are on track for
college and careers.

Student achievement will increase by 2% over baseline on site, district and state assessments.

Increase the percentage of students scoring at or above the benchmark on the STAR Reading Test in grades 3-8.

Provide academic interventions and supports for students in K-6 to increase percentage of students entering middle school at grade level in ELA and math by 2% over baseline.

62% of English learners will increase one level of English proficiency as measured by the CELDT.

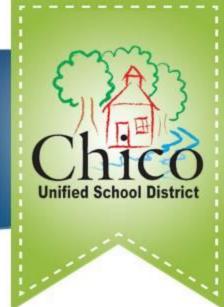
Provide academic interventions and supports for students in K-12 to increase students meeting a-g requirements by 3% over previous year.

Increase by 1% students who complete a CTE pathways sequence.

Goal 3: Actions and Services

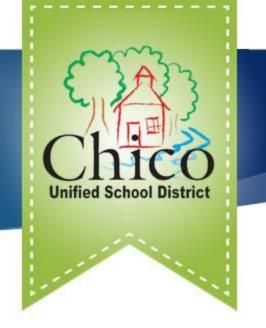
- Secondary counselors will <u>implement and</u> <u>monitor college/career plans</u> for all students, especially those in subgroups, as identified in Year 1.
- 2. Implement <u>academic interventions</u> (examples: Reading Pals, Response to Intervention, math lab, Read 180, Power Reading) using site allocations of LCAP funds to provide TK-12 students with the academic support to stay on grade level as funding allows.

Goal 3: Actions and Services



- 3. Provide <u>TCMs</u>, <u>EL and instructional</u> <u>specialists</u>, <u>and TK instructional aides</u> for TK-12 academic support and improved instruction.
- 4. Research options for providing an <u>all-day or extended day</u> <u>Kindergarten</u> at all elementary sites.
- 5. Continue <u>after school homework support</u> at Elementary and Secondary as per site's needs.

Goal 4: Parent Involvement and Input



Expected Annual Measurable Outcomes:

Increase the number of parents accessing student performance information from 25% to 50%.

Increase
consistency of
timely teacher
response (amount
of increase will
depend on
baseline).

Provide staff training and TCM support to increase parent involvement by 5% over baseline.

Goal 4: Actions and Services

- Chico Unified School District
- 1. Provide **teacher training** in using Parent Portal in:
 - Illuminate for 4th through 6th grade teachers
 - Aeries for secondary teachers.
- 2. Provide <u>parent training</u> in English and other languages addressing parent access to:
 - Parent Portal feature in Aeries and Illuminate
 - Academic programs to support student learning, such as: Google Apps for Education, software to support California Content State Standards learning at home, Rosetta Stone, etc.

Goal 4: Actions and Services

- 3. Provide <u>TCM and/or other staff support</u> for increasing parent participation, frequency of meetings for secondary English Learner Advisory Committee, and District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC)
- 4. <u>Establish baseline for parent involvement</u> in Parent Information/Back to School Nights, PTA Meetings, SSC, Site ELAC, and DELAC.

Goal 5: Improve School Climate



Expected Annual Measurable Outcomes:

Maintain attendance rates at or above 95% rate.

Decrease chronic absenteeism from 9.6% to 9.4%.

Decrease the dropout rate by 1%; increase the "save rate" (i.e. students who were not on track to graduate, but with intervention and support, achieved a high school diploma).

Increase high school graduation and/or program completion rate by 1%.

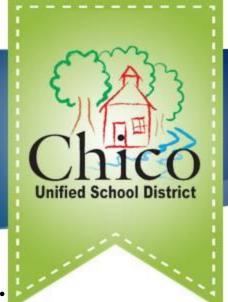
Reduce the student referrals, suspension and expulsion rates by 1% from previous year.

Reduce "Out of School Suspensions" annually by 1%.

Goal 5: Actions and Services

- Chico Unified School District
- Provide <u>professional development for certificated and classified</u> <u>staff</u> in:
 - becoming a trauma-informed district
 - behavior strategies such as Positive Behavior and Intervention Supports and the Nurtured Heart Approach
- Continue support for Alternative Education Programs: <u>Opportunity Program, Out of School suspension alternatives (e.g. Reset and ISS)</u>, and <u>Alternative Ed. Supplemental staffing.</u>
- 3. Provide <u>health</u>, <u>social-emotional counseling support and services</u> (e.g. EMHI, PIP, Nurses, Health Aides, LVNs, Cal Safe Teen Parenting Program, Medically Necessary/Off Campus Instruction, and Home to School Transportation).

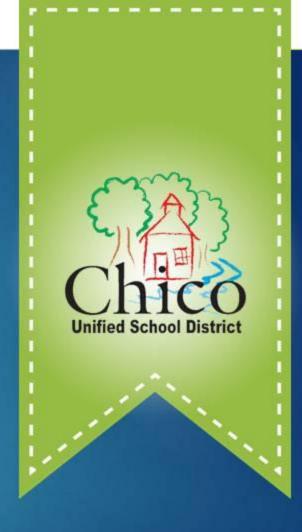
Goal 5: Actions and Services



- 4. Increase campus supervision as per site needs.
- Support student engagement at the high schools by <u>encouraging participation in sports teams</u>. (Athletic Coaching Stipends)
- Support student engagement in <u>Art, Music, and PE activities at</u> the elementary schools. (Elementary Art, Music, PE Release Days)

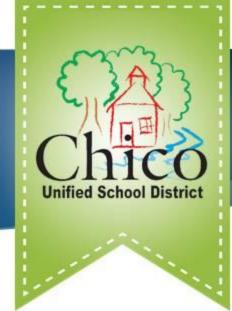
