For the 2005/06 fiscal years, CUSD is projecting total revenues of \$101,384,830 and expenditures of \$105,917,816 for a decrease in fund balance of (\$4,642,986). This deficit amount includes \$2,978,303 of carryover from 04/05, so the actual deficit spending amount is (\$1,554,683). CUSD has used one-time funds to soften cuts, but more cuts will be necessary as on-going expenditures continue to exceed on-going revenues and using one-time funds only delays the inevitable.

The Summer Literacy Workshop is a follow-up to the professional development in differentiated literacy strategies that was given by Kate Kinsella at the High School Summit and in a one-day follow-up workshop at Pleasant Valley in September. Julie Adams, a consultant for Kate Kinsella, is facilitating this three-day workshop. The workshop will consist of instruction in effective literacy strategies and planning time for teachers, so they can implement in fall 2006. Teachers who participate (32 total, 16 from PV and 16 from CHS) will commit to four meetings during the 2006/2007 school year. Background Information

MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) is an after school intervention program for students typically under-represented at UC and CSU who have the potential and ability to go to the university. The MESA program emphasizes math, science and academic (research and analysis) type reading and writing. The methods we use are both the usual (instruction and practice) and, more often, direct application of skills to, projects (designing and building things like bridges, model hearts, mousetrap cars and airplanes, developing web sites, researching technological and sociological topics and presenting your findings in business style oral presentations, to name a few) and competitions with ourselves and other schools in the above listed areas as well as problem solving and thinking competitions. In MESA, we also participate in intensive career exploration and university research, workshops on SAT/ACT prep, financial aide, and parent education, and scholarship hunts. Because getting to college (and succeeding) is such hard work, we play 'hard' in MESA too. At the end of each year we have an overnight field trip for students who work hard, earn good grades and participate actively in MESA. This year we raised the money to go kayaking in the Santa Cruz harbor, tour the Winchester Mystery house and tour an aircraft carrier. We plan to go on May 11-13, 2006.

Educational Implications

Our trip is intended to be enriching and very fun. In Santa Cruz we will be looking at sea life (seals, sea otters, birds, kelp, etc.), hanging at the beach (which many of my students have never seen), and checking out tide pools and the land-water interface. Of course, we are timing our trip so we can also check out the Santa Cruz boardwalk. At the Winchester house we will look at architecture and folklore. The USS Hornet is the aircraft carrier that picked up the Apollo 11 astronauts upon their return from the moon. We will tour the ship, be given hands-on opportunities to check out Navy life and learn the role this ship has played in various times of US history.

Fiscal Implications

This trip should cost around \$8000-9000. The MESA students have been raising money all year for the trip. There is no financial implications to the district.

These schools would like to focus Teacher Recruitment and Support Program funding on providing release time and collaboration for their respective staffs. The schools have been diligently working on pacing guides at all grade levels and collecting and analyzing data. They have been utilizing grade level meetings to have conversations about the lessons and standards being taught and assessed. The principals at these school sites felt that additional time for teachers to collaborate and plan is essential for the momentum to move forward in a positive fashion. The ultimate goal for each school is to have curriculum coaches to support teachers at each grade level with the primary emphasis on the Language Arts curriculum. Included in those discussions will be best practices, strategies and support for English Language Learners. These coaches would be an integral part of the release time and collaborative model. District staff is currently working on plans to support the schools in this endeavor.

The teaching staff at these schools are Highly Qualified based on NCLB guidelines. This allows all teachers at their respective sites to continue building staff development, planning and collaboration time on a common theme and a common language. The goal for all of this planning, coaching and collaboration time is to improve student academic outcomes.

Oakdale School is the 4th school listed for TRSSP funding. Oakdale is CUSD's independent study program. The school board may grant a waiver of the requirement to pass the HSEE under certain conditions.

A waiver is ONLY required for students who:

- (1) Took one or both portions of the CAHSEE with a modification(s); AND,
- (2) Attained the "equivalent of a passing score" (350 or more points) on the CAHSEE.

At the parent or guardian's request, a school principal shall submit a request for a waiver of the requirement to successfully pass the high school exit examination to the governing board of the school district.

Educational Implications

If a student takes the test with modifications and receives a score of 350 or higher, s/he is eligible for a waiver of the requirement to pass the High School Exit Exam. All other graduation requirements must be met.

STUDENT TEACHING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between the State of California through the Trustees of The California State University on behalf of the University noted below, all of which are hereinafter called "State" or "University", and the School District noted below, hereinafter called the "District":

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to enter into agreements with the State to provide teaching experience through practice teaching to students enrolled in teacher education curricula of the University; and

WHEREAS, the University desires to place students in District for practice teaching experience under a supervisory teacher:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the State and the District as follows:

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The University, District, and agreement term are as follows:

Chico Unified School District

Term:

From July 1, 2006 to

June 30, 2010

GENERAL TERMS

The District shall provide to University students teaching experience through practice teaching in schools and classes of the District. Such practice teaching shall be provided in such schools or classes of the District, and under the direct supervision and instruction of such employees of the District, as the District and the State through their duly authorized representatives may agree upon.

The District may, for good cause, refuse to accept for practice teaching any student of the University assigned to practice teaching in the District, and upon request of the District, made for good cause, the State shall terminate the assignment of any student of the University to practice teaching in the District.

"Practice teaching" as used herein and elsewhere in this agreement means active participation in the duties and functions of the classroom teaching under the direct supervision and instruction of employees of the District holding valid teaching credentials issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing, other than emergency or provisional credentials, authorizing them to serve as classroom teachers in the schools or classes in which the practice teaching is provided.

A semester unit of practice teaching for elementary and secondary schools constitutes of approximately 60 2. clock hours practice teaching.

3. An assignment of a student of the University to practice teaching in schools or classes of the District shall be deemed, at the discretion of the State, either for approximately nine (9) weeks or for approximately eighteen (18) weeks, but a student may be given more than one assignment by the University to practice teaching in such schools or classrooms.

The assignment of a student of the University to practice teaching in the District shall be deemed to be effective for the purpose of this agreement as of the date the student presents to the proper authorities of the District the assignment card or other documentation given the student by the University effecting such assignment, but not earlier than the date of such assignment as shown on such card or other document.

- 4. Worker's compensation insurance shall be at the cost of the University.
- 5. The District shall be responsible for damages caused by the negligence of its officers, employees and agents. The State shall be responsible for damages caused by the negligence of its officers, employees and agents. The intent of this paragraph is to impose responsibility on each party for the negligence of its officers, employees and agents.

The CSEA's covered unit members, as defined in the Agreement, include those holding the positions described herein.

WHEREAS Article 1, Section 1.5.1 of the Agreement recognizes the authority of the District to make decisions to eliminate services and layoff therefrom.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board authorizes the District Superintendent to give notice to the affected classified employee(s) of the layoff in accordance with Education Code Sections 45117 and 45308 and pursuant to Article 4 of the current collective bargaining agreement and pursuant to Merit System rules, such notice to be given at least forty-five (45) working days prior to the effective date of each layoff as set forth above.

The Board authorizes and directs the Superintendent to carry forth all layoff proceedings resulting from the elimination of position(s) ordered herein above, including proceedings for layoff provided by the exercise of displacement rights and to service layoff notices to employees affected thereby. Where an employee displaces an employee holding a position in another class, the Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed to carry forth layoff proceedings resulting therefrom and to serve layoff notices to employees affected thereby. All such layoffs shall be as of the designated effective date, forty-five (45) working days from notices of layoff.

In the event that an employee affected by the layoff proceedings authorized by this resolution chooses to retire or resign from District service, or other appropriate resolution is made, the Superintendent is authorized to rescind the layoff.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that as of the 3rd day of June, 2006, three classified position(s) of the CHICO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT be reduced or discontinued to the extent hereinabove set forth.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent of this School District be and hereby is authorized and directed to give notice of termination of employment to affected classified employee(s) of this School District pursuant to Merit System rules and regulations and applicable provisions of the Education Code of the State of California not less than 45 days prior to the effective date of layoff as set forth above.

The Board authorizes and directs the Superintendent to carry forth all layoff proceedings resulting from the elimination of position(s) ordered herein above, including proceedings for layoff provided by the exercise of displacement rights and to service layoff notices to employees affected thereby. Where an employee displaces an employee holding a position in another class, the Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed to carry forth layoff proceedings resulting therefrom and to serve layoff notices to employees affected thereby.

In the event that an employee affected by the layoff proceedings authorized by this resolution chooses to retire or resign from District service, or other appropriate resolution is made, the Superintendent is authorized to rescind the layoff.

Background Information

The California Energy Commission's 2006 Lower-Emission School Bus Program Guidelines have been issued. The program has two components, (1) new bus replacement for pre-1977 model year school buses and (2) the retrofitting of in-use diesel school buses that meet certain criteria.

Under the new guidelines, Chico Unified School District is not eligible for the new bus replacement program; however, we have one school bus that does qualify for the retrofit component of the program.

Educational Implications

The primary goal of the Lower-Emission School Bus Program is to reduce school children's exposure to both cancer-causing and smog-forming pollution thus meeting

Fiscal Implications

The program no longer requires a match from the District; therefore, there is no fiscal impact to the District's budget.
