Community Day School

On May 18, 2005, the Board of Education expressed an interest in operating a Community Day School. Education Code Section 17292.5 provides for housing of a Community Day School as follows:

"If the governing board of a school district operates a program for expelled pupils, the governing board shall do one or more of the following:

- Utilize available school facilities that conform to the requirements of Part 2 (commencing with Section 2-101), Part 3 (commencing with Section 3-089-1), Part 4 (commencing with Section 4-403), and Part 5 (commencing with Section 5-102), of Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations.
- Apply for emergency portable classrooms pursuant to Chapter 25 (commencing with Section 17085) of Part 10.
- Enter into lease agreements for facilities, provided that the facilities are limited to a structure where a structural engineer has submitted a report that determines substantial structural hazards do not exist.
- Before entering into any lease pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision

   (a), the governing board of the school district shall certify to the State
   Allocation Board that all reasonable efforts have been made to locate the program in facilities that conform to the structural safety standards listed in paragraph (1) of subdivision (a).
- On or before September 1, 1996, and every three years thereafter, each school district shall report to the State Allocation Board on the facilities

utilized for the operation of these programs and efforts to place programs in facilities that conform with the requirements of Part 2 (commencing with Section 2-101), Part 3 (commencing with Section 3-089-1), Part 4 commencing with Section 4-403), and Part 5 (commencing with Section 5-102), of Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations."

Due to the lack of appropriate Chico Unified School District facilities for the proposed Community Day School and the District's inability to qualify for State emergency portable classrooms, the District is proposing leasing a commercial building at 2412 Cohasset Road, Suite 3

As required by the Education Code, the District contracted with Steve Gonsalves, a structural engineer with Nichols, Melburg and Rossetto, to review the facility for conformance with the appropriate structural safety requirements. A copy of his findings is attached.

### RECOMMENDATION:

That, as per Education Code Section 17292.5, the Board of Education authorizes staff to submit the findings to the State Allocation Board and provide the necessary certifications, via the attached State forms.

This letter documents the structural condition of the proposed Community Day School buildings investigated during our site visit on May 26, 2005. This evaluation is issued as required by Section 17292.5 of the California Education Code. The inspections performed and the findings below are based on visual observation only. No destructive tests of any kind were performed.

### **Existing Structures**

The existing campus is comprised of three separate buildings located at 2412 Cohasset Road in Chico, California. Two of the structures are metal buildings. Their roof systems consist of metal deck over Z-purlins. The roofs are fastened to the Z-purlins with screws and are used as the horizontal diaphragms. Their lateral systems consist of steel beam and column bents in the transverse direction and portal frames in the longitudinal direction. The third building is a modular building. The modular building has a placard with a California state seal. It has been designed for a roof live load of 20 psf and a wind load of 17.4 psf. The identifying numbers on the placard were 104968 and 22791.

### Inspection Findings

We did not find any evidence of structural problems with any of the buildings during our investigation and the buildings appeared to be in conformance with the requirements of the current California Building Code. We could not verify the foundation system under the modular building during our site visit. The foundations for the modular building may require staking to provide adequate anchorage to the ground



### Conclusions

Based on the observations during our site we believe that the proposed Community Day School buildings do not present a substantial structural hazard and do meet the local safety standards.
