





Background Information

We are planning a field trip to the Full Belly Farms, which is an organic, sustainable farm near Capay in Yolo County. We chose to go to full Belly Farms because this 5/6 class has been studying chemistry/physical science involving elements critical to sustaining life. We have also been investigating how these elements are involved and function in a variety of human body systems such as the digestive system, respiratory system, circulatory system and excretory system. This field trip is the culminating activity that integrates these aspects of chemistry and biology: why we, as humans, need certain elements; how these elements are ingested and used by the human body; and how the elements in pesticides and artificial additives in food can impact human body systems.

Education Implications

In conjunction with the science units described above, the students have also been investigating the nutritional aspects of food, food portions and how food is processed and arrives in stores. Students are keeping a food journal to keep track of their daily intake, and they are also learning about how food transported from South America or even farther away impacts the environment. These units of instruction follow the 5th grade science standards for the State of California. The goal of these units and field trip is to help students understand their own eating habits, the impact of chemical elements on their food, and the kinds of elements and nutrition that are healthy and sustainable. Hopefully, this will lead to healthy habits for a lifetime.

Fiscal Implications

The fiscal implications for the District are none. All money will be earned through fundraising or donations from parents.

Additional Information

This is an opportunity for students to see the connection between science, especially biology and environmental science, and how they lead their lives in terms of healthy choices for both themselves and the environment.

Background Information

Students with disabilities who take the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) with modification (for example, using a calculator on the math test or having the English Language Arts test read aloud) receive an invalid score on the test. The school board may grant a waiver of the requirement to pass the CAHSEE under certain conditions.

A waiver is only required for students who:

- 1) Took one or both portions of the CAHSEE with a modifications AND
- 2) Attained the equivalent of a passing score (350 or more points) on the CAHSEE.

At the parent or guardian's request, a school principal shall submit a request for a waiver of the requirement to successfully pass the high school exit examination to the governing board of the school district.

Educational Implications

If a student takes one or both portions of the CAHSEE with modifications and receives a passing score (350 or higher), s/he is eligible for a waiver of the requirement to pass the California High School Exit Exam. All other graduation requirements must be met.

Background information

In August of 2007, Chico Unified School District submitted a Career Technical Education Facilities Grant Application for the Chico High School Arts, Media and Entertainment Industry (AMEI) CTE Restructuring Plan. The major components of construction are: the addition of a sound booth and teaching station area to the rear of the Williams Theater and the installation of live/production sound and video systems to facilitate instruction. Additionally, the existing AMEI building will be reconfigured acoustically treated and lighting and HVAC systems will be added. The District received bids from eight contractors ranging from \$313,000 to \$499,750.

Educational Implications

This project consists of the construction of a multimedia production technology platform that will facilitate certification-level training in all three AMEI Industry Sector programs: Media and Design Arts, Production/Managerial Arts and Performing Arts.

Fiscal Implications

50% of this project will be funded by a School Facilities Program Career Technical Education Funding Grant, and 50% will be matched with Measure A Bond funds.

Recommendation

Bids for the project were opened on Tuesday, April 27, 2010. Pending approval, the project is scheduled to begin during the summer of 2010. Therefore, it is requested that the Board of Education grant authorization to the Superintendent to award the project to Modern Building Company who was the lowest responsive bidder, for the amount of \$313,000.00.

Background information

In January of 2008, Chico Unified School District submitted a Career Technical Education Facilities Grant Application for the Chico High School Agriculture and Natural Resources Facilities Upgrades. The major components of construction are: the addition of a covered (all-weather) work area which includes concrete, lighting, and electrical, reconfiguration of the existing classroom space, the removal of asphalt and replacement with concrete paving, the removal and replacement of the electrical and irrigation system in the greenhouse and the re-siding of Greenhouse Number 3. The District received bids from nine contractors ranging from \$183,333 to \$245,736.

Educational Implications

The overall goal of this project is to restructure the current Agriculture program into six career pathway programs (Agriscience, Plant Science, Agricultural Business, Agricultural Mechanics, Animal Science and Ornamental Horticulture).

Fiscal Implications

50% of this project will be funded by a School Facilities Program Career Technical Education Funding Grant, and 50% will be matched with Measure A Bond funds.

Recommendation

Bids for the project were opened on Tuesday, April 27, 2010. Pending approval, the project is scheduled to begin during the summer of 2010. Background Information

An IRS Section 125 "Cafeteria Plan" refers to a specific Internal Revenue Service code section authorizing entities to have certain qualifying medical and dependent care expenses run through payroll as pre tax items on an employee's paycheck. The result for the employee is higher take home pay. The District has previously adopted Cafeteria Plans for its Management, Confidential, and CSEA unit members in 1996 and more recently in 2005 for CUTA unit members.

The Maximum Annual Contribution per employee authorized by the District has been \$2,000 since the initial adoption of the Plans. The cost of medical insurance premiums, out of pocket deductibles, co-pays, co-insurance and medical claims has all increased over the years due to relatively high medical industry inflation without a corresponding increase in the Maximum Annual Contribution amount.

Recent changes in federal law pertaining to H.R. 3590, the Health Care and Education Affordability Reconciliation Act of 2010 limits the Cafeteria Plan Maximum Annual Contribution amount to \$2,500 in January, 2013, therefore the recommendation to help offset Chico Unified's inflation over the years is to set the maximum to the upcoming federal limit of \$2,500.

Educational Implications

N/A

Fiscal Implications

There is a small risk of an employee designating the entire \$2,500 maximum, submitting receipts for full reimbursement in the beginning of the year; then terminating employment early in the year - prior to the employee monthly checks fully reimbursing the full \$2,500. This has happened with a handful of employees since 1996. The Cafeteria Plan checking account has sufficient funds to accommodate this minor risk since unused annual employee balances remain with the district in the account.

The Health Care Flexible Spending Account: Maximum Annual Contribution Amount any Employee may elect shall be raised from \$2,000 to \$2,500 for the Plan Year starting July 1, 2010.

It is the intent of the Board of Trustees that all contracts, plans, policies, and other legal documents be amended to reflect this change. All rights and coverage shall remain the same.

RESOLVED, that full power and authority are hereby conferred upon the Superintendent of the Chico Unified School District to execute amendments to such Plan within the general intent and purpose thereof in order that the Plan shall qualify under the provisions of Section 125 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

WHEREAS the District and the California School Employees Association, Chico Chapter 110 (CSEA) executed a Collective Bargaining Agreement (Agreement) effective July 1, 2007 through November 15, 2010. The CSEA's covered unit members, as defined in the Agreement, include those holding the positions described herein.

WHEREAS Article 1, Section 1.5.1 of the Agreement recognizes the authority of the District to make decisions to eliminate services and layoff therefrom.

WHEREAS Article 4 of the aforesaid Agreement covers layoff and reemployment and specifically provides that said Article includes all of the impact and effects of any layoff, demotion and/or reemployment for unit members and is thus a waiver to further bargain the effects of any specific decision to eliminate services and layoff therefrom, except as provided therein.

WHEREAS CSEA has been apprised of the contemplated elimination of services described herein in order to afford it the opportunity to exercise its rights under the Agreement.

NOW, therefore, be it resolved the Board has this date adopted the Superintendent's recommendations and ordered a reduction of classified services, and it appears to the Board that due to a lack of funds it is necessary to eliminate certain classified position(s) and to layoff affected employee(s) hereinabove set forth.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board authorizes the District Superintendent to give notice to the affected classified employee(s) of the layoff in accordance with Education Code Sections 45117 and 45308 and pursuant to Article 4 of the current collective bargaining agreement and pursuant to Merit System rules, such notice to be given at least forty-five (45) working days prior to the effective date of each layoff as set forth above.

The Board authorizes and directs the Superintendent to carry forth all layoff proceedings resulting from the elimination of position(s) ordered herein above, including proceedings for layoff provided by the exercise of displacement rights and to service layoff notices to employees

affected thereby. Where an employee displaces an employee holding a position in another class, the Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed to carry forth layoff proceedings resulting therefrom and to serve layoff notices to employees affected thereby. All such layoffs shall be as of the designated effective date, forty-five (45) working days from notices of layoff.

In the event that an employee affected by the layoff proceedings authorized by this resolution chooses to retire or resign from District service, or other appropriate resolution is made, the Superintendent is authorized to rescind the layoff.
