INFORMATION, PROCEDURES AND CONDUCT OF CUSD BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETINGS

No disturbance or willful interruption of any Board meeting shall be permitted. Persistence by an individual or group shall be grounds for the Chair to terminate the privilege of addressing the meeting. The Board may remove disruptive individuals and order the room cleared, if necessary. In this case, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda.

CONSENT CALENDAR

The items listed on the Consent Calendar may be approved by the Board in one action. However, in accordance with law, the public has a right to comment on any consent item. At the request of a member of the Board, any item on the consent agenda shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a regular agenda item. Board Bylaw 9322.

STUDENT PARTICIPATION

At the discretion of the Board President, student speakers may be given priority to address items to the Board.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATON FOR ITEMS ON THE AGENDA (Regular and Special Board Meetings)

The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board either before or during the Board's consideration of each item of business to be discussed at regular or special meetings.

- Speakers will identify themselves and will direct their comments to the Board.
- Each speaker will be allowed three (3) minutes to address the Board.
- In case of numerous requests to address the same item, the Board may select representatives to speak on each side of the item.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATON FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA (Regular Board Meetings only)

The Board shall not take action or enter into discussion or dialog on any matter that is not on the meeting agenda, except as allowed by law. (Government Code 54954.2) Items brought forth at this part of the meeting may be referred to the Superintendent or designee or the Board may take the item under advisement. The matter may be placed on the agenda of a subsequent meeting for discussion or action by the Board.

- Public comments for items not on the agenda will be limited to one hour in duration (15 minutes at the beginning of the meeting and 45 minutes at the end of the meeting).
- Initially, each general topic will be limited to 3 speakers.
- Speakers will identify themselves and will direct their comments to the Chair.
- Each speaker will be given three (3) minutes to address the Board.
- Once 2 speakers have shared a similar viewpoint, the Chair will ask for a differing viewpoint. If no other viewpoint is represented then a 3rd speaker may present.
- Speakers will not be allowed to yield their time to other speakers.
- After all topics have been heard, the remainder of the hour may be used by additional speakers to address a previously raised issue.

WRITTEN MATERIAL:

The Board is unable to read written materials presented during the meeting. If any person intends to appear before the Board with written materials, they should be delivered to the Superintendent's Office or delivered via e-mail to the Board and Superintendent 10 days prior to the meeting date.

Background Information

While it has been subject to several changes in location, the CUSD Alternative Education program continues to be one of the top Alternative Education programs in the region. The Alternative Education campus is home to Fair View High School, a Continuation High School (Model School status in 1989 and 1994); Academy For Change, a Community Day School (Federally recognized program of excellence in 2008); Oakdale, an Independent Study High School; and Center for Alternative Learning, a program for 6th -8th grade students (Golden Bell Award in 2005). Alternative Education staff will provide a tour of the Alternative Education Facility as well as information related to the past, present, and future of Alternative Education in Chico.

Educational Implications

Alternative Education provides an option for students who otherwise would likely drop out of school. The variety of programs offered is tailored to fit the needs of the students, and as a result, students not only receive an education, but many graduate and go on to receive post secondary education and/or training.

Fiscal Implications

Alternative Education is one means by which CUSD retains students in our school system that otherwise would likely drop out of school. This retention of students has a positive impact on enrollment.

At the request of the Board the item was tabled until there was more input from the employee groups. The information was provided again to those groups in an effort to have more input and consultation. The Board adopted the student calendar for three (3) school years (2009/10, 2010/11 and 2011/12) in February 2009. One common component of those adopted calendars was the placement of "spring break" during the week of March 17th. This was done to have the CUSD "spring break" be the same as those of CSU, Chico and Butte College. At the time of the adoption the understanding was that the "spring break" would be the week in which March 17th fell. In 2012, March 17th falls on a Saturday. The CUSD student calendar was built based on the belief that CSU, Chico and Butte College would take their "spring break" the week leading up to March 17, 2012, CSU, Chico announced that their "spring break" in 2012 would be the week following March 17, 2012. Butte College subsequently adopted a student calendar that was the same. The modification proposed to the CUSD student calendar for the 2011/12 school year would move our "spring break" from the week prior to March 17, 2012 (as currently adopted) to the week following March 17, 2012. **Educational Implications:**

The student attendance calendar that is attached as "Attachment A" is established for the 2011/2012 school year.


