- Continue to implement PBIS at all sites for behavior supports
- Increased Targeted Case Manager time to full-time
- Additional Counselors fully funded through 2026-27
- Work with local transportation agencies to explore possibilities for home/school transportation
- Pursue the Community Schools Implementation Grant
